Residential Parking System



Parking in Downtown Holland

This brochure contains information on Downtown Holland's residential parking system. The detailed map shows available parking areas for overnight residential parking.

This system is designed to accommodate all users, (customers, employees and residents) and your adherence to these policies is necessary to ensure a parking system that functions optimally. Failure to comply with these policies will result in the revocation of your permit. Downtown's Parking System At-A-Glance

Downtown's parking system is managed by the Downtown Development Authority (DDA). The system's annual budget is received from property assessments within the Downtown Zoning Districts. The parking budget is used for maintenance items (such as lot striping, paving, lighting, and landscaping), rental payments to lot owners, and other land improvements related to parking. The DDA meets monthly and reviews parking requests and policy recommendations as needed.

Residential Parking Policies

Downtown Holland is pleased to be able to offer overnight parking to Downtown residents that are not provided a private parking space. Because the Downtown Parking System is a shared system, long-term overnight parking spaces may not be in a location that is most convenient to your place of residence. Please note that overnight on-street parking is prohibited within the Downtown district.

Designated Lots and Spaces

The Downtown Parking Map indicates overnight parking lot designations. Overnight permit holders are allowed to park in any designated overnight lots within the Downtown area. The difference between long-term and short-term designations are:

Long-term: Overnight permit holders may park their vehicles in the designated spaces within these lots for a 24 hour period. A limited number of long-term spaces are available in the 9th Street Parking Deck with the purchase of an annual deck permit.

Short-term: Overnight permit holders may park their vehicles in these lots between the hours of **6:30 pm - 9:30 am only**, Monday - Saturday, and all day on Sunday. This allows the parking spaces to open up for customers during the day.

Overnight Parking Registration

1. All Downtown Holland overnight parking registration is done through the DDA office (150 West 8th Street) or online at www.downtownholland.com/parking.
2. Overnight parking applicants must show proof of vehicle registration when applying for an overnight permit, or permit will be denied.
3. A permit is valid only for the vehicle and license plate number noted on the permit application. Any changes must be approved by the DDA and the City of Holland Public Safety Department.
4. The permit (sticker) shall be displayed and affixed in the lower left-hand corner (driver's side) of your vehicle's rear windshield.
5. Signing the permit application verifies that you have received this brochure and understand fully the contents therein.

Parking Ordinances

1. Permits may be revoked by the DDA for non-compliance with any of the provisions of the Ordinance Code of 2. The City Treasurer is authorized to deny renewal of a permit to an applicant for non-compliance with the provisions of the Ordinance Code of the City of Holland.*

3. Any motor vehicle remaining in a parking space continuously for more than a three (3) day period shall be presumptively deemed abandoned and subject to impoundment pursuant to the Ordinance Code of the City of Holland.

Fees, Fines, and Enforcement

The fees for Overnight Residential Parking Permits are as follows:

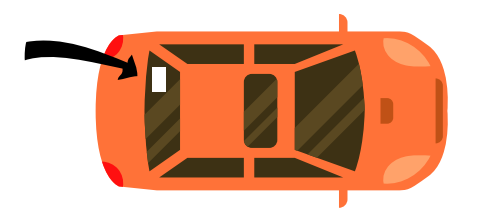
Weekly	\$20
1-3 Months	\$100
4-6 Months	\$200
Annual	\$400
Annual 9th St. Deck	\$575

Fees will not be pro-rated. Fees subject to change. Permit replacements are charged the same rate as original permits.

Fines: Failure to comply with the rules and regulations stated in this brochure will result in a fine of \$15.00 or more and the possible revocation of your permit.

Enforcement: The Holland Public Safety Department and the DDA are responsible for enforcing these rules and regulations. All citation inquiries must be directed to the Holland Public Safety Department.

Permit must be affixed to the rear windshield in the lower left-hand corner (driver's side).

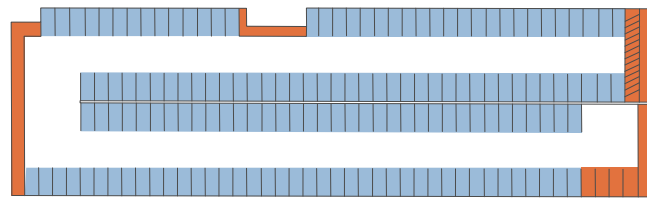
Available Residential Parking

Residents may only park in designated overnight spaces according to the map. Failure to do so may result in a citation. Repeated violations may result in the revocation of your permit.

-  **Long-Term Overnight Parking**
(Daytime Parking Allowed)
-  **Short-Term Overnight Parking**
(No Daytime Parking Allowed)
Spaces available Monday through Saturday from 6:30 pm - 9:30 am and all day Sunday.
-  **No Overnight Parking Anytime**
On-Street Overnight Parking is also not permitted.

9th Street Parking Deck

Long-term overnight parking is permitted on the top level of the 9th Street Parking Deck only as indicated in blue on the map below. Covered parking is permitted by special permit on the middle and ground floors only.
